What is the Virtual Career Fair?

The Virtual G.I. Jobs Career Fair is a 2-hour online job event for military veterans, offering them the chance to **meet and greet recruiters at government agencies and contracting companies for employment opportunities**.

This August 26th career fair provides a range of job options with employers that collectively have several thousand openings for a wide range of positions.

What Conversations Should I Be Prepared For?

After conducting your ongoing research for government agency and federal contracting positions for veterans, you can ask for details about job requirements. Some topics to consider are how the employer determines a strong fit, timelines they work with, and other questions that will clarify whether or not you're a likely match for both the position as well as the culture.



Avoid distracting recruiters with personal questions or other unwanted informal talks. Stay focused on professional rapportbuilding to leave a strong, positive impression.
